Update from Council Meeting — November 28th, 2016

- ⇒ During Council's Committee of the Whole session, several local residents, including elected leadership from Lax Kw'alaams and the Chamber of Commerce, came out to voice their support for the Pacific Northwest LNG project.
- ⇒ Council heard a report from the Mayor regarding the **public consultation and design process for 3rd Avenue and City-held waterfront from Kwinitsa Station to Seal Cove**. The process took 4 days, 200 combined hours of work from the design team, and over 20 meetings with the public. The draft result was shared with the public in a meeting last Thursday, with their designs to be shared further once finalized. Many of the design ideas focused on making the City's public spaces more pedestrian friendly, safe, and interconnected.
- ⇒ Council heard a second update from the Mayor regarding **2 affordable housing developments approved by the Province for Prince Rupert, totaling 60 units**. The City has been working in coordination with the Province and area First Nations to secure these important developments, and will continue to do so.
