Update from Council Meeting — May 30th, 2016

- ⇒ Council held a Committee of the Whole meeting, which was open to public to share general concerns and issues.
- ⇒ Council heard a presentation from the Terrace Conservation Office regarding incidences involving wolves in Prince Rupert. The CO reported that there is a wolf pack living on Kaien Island, but that only isolated individuals within the pack will occasionally cause problems. This year a problem wolf was removed, and complaints have now discontinued. If you see a wolf, you can help the Conservation Office identify problems and a response by calling 1 877 952 7277. Some simple tips they provided if you encounter a wolf are:
 - 1.) Make yourself look large
 - 2.) Wave your arms and throw objects
 - 3.) Shout in a loud, aggressive voice
- ⇒ Council heard a report from the City Planner regarding a bylaw to establish policies and procedures to require Development Approval Information, and Council gave first, second, and third readings the corresponding Impact Assessment Bylaw No. 3393, 2016. This is a procedural bylaw to implement the Land Use Policy Framework that was adopted in a previous session of Council.
- ⇒ Council heard an additional report from the City Planner regarding amendment to the OCP that would enable the implementation of the aforementioned policy framework, and gave first and second Readings to the City of Prince Rupert Quality of Life Official Community Plan Amending Bylaw No. 3394, 2016. A public hearing on the OCP amendment will be held at 7:00 pm on June 13th, immediately prior to the regular Council Meeting.
- ⇒ Council gave first second and third reading to Emergency Management Program Bylaw No. 3392, 2016, with the recommendation to appoint City Fire Chief Dave Mckenzie as the City's Emergency Management Coordinator.
- ⇒ Council gave first, second and third Readings to the Road Closure and Removal of Road Dedication Bylaw No. 3391, 2016 (Portion of 3rd Avenue West, Besner Block) required to provision the Easement associated with the Besner Block building.
